## FROM OUR PASTOR'S DESK

#### The Baptism of the Lord

In my second year of theology studies, I went to confession to a priest visiting the seminary for a three-day retreat. My heart wasn't in it. I was going through the motions. I confessed my sins and waited for his response. The priest said, "For your penance, I'd like you to go into the chapel and repeat the words 'You are my beloved Son, with you I am well pleased' (Luke 3:22) until they mean something to you." Easy penance, I thought.

But to my surprise, I struggled to say those words. I sensed a strong interior resistance blocking them. How could God be well-pleased with me? He couldn't be, I thought. A battle within me ensued. Two hours later, the resistance vanished, and I found myself able to speak, and claim as my own, those marvelous words. I emerged from the chapel with a new, deep, peaceful conviction that I was indeed God's beloved son.

Those words are a precious gift from heaven to all of us. Jesus' baptism, which we celebrate this week, offers them to us. Are we willing to receive these words anew? Many things can block this deepening of our baptismal identity: failings, sins, disappointments, traumas, problems, and so on. Yet God's love is always greater. This week I challenge you to prayerfully repeat these words over yourself — or perhaps over someone you're struggling to love — until those words find a home in your heart.

Feast of the Epiphany

My dear friends in Christ,

On May 9, 2024, Pope Francis announced the Ordinary Jubilee Year of 2025 in the Bull of Indiction *Spes non confundit* which comes from St. Paul's Letter to the Romans and is translated "Hope does not disappoint." This Jubilee year began last weekend in our diocese and will conclude on Holy Family Sunday, December 28, 2025.

Celebrated at regular intervals since the year 1300, Jubilee years are celebrations of Jesus' love and mercy, and have a particular focus for the Church. This upcoming Jubilee year, Pope Francis is calling on us to renew ourselves in hope, bringing the gift of hope to a world so desperately in need of it.

Pope Francis suggests many ways of celebrating the Jubilee of Hope; they include working for peace and an end to conflicts, promoting human life, showing amnesty to prisoners, upholding the dignity of migrants, healing the sick, and accompanying the elderly.

For our personal sanctification, the pope encourages pilgrimages, particularly to Rome, and for those who cannot make such a journey then pious visits to holy places closer to home. Additionally, the Holy Father urges us to be renewed in reconciliation.

Receiving indulgences are an important part of the Jubilee journey. Abused in the past, they remain a legitimate spiritual gift. Pope Francis has emphasized the blessing of this teaching. "Indulgence on the part of the Father who, through the Bride of Christ, his Church, reaches the pardoned sinner and frees him or her from every residue left by the consequences of sin."

In order to gain a plenary indulgence, you must perform the act with a contrite and sincere heart. You must go to confession, receive Holy Communion, and pray for the pope's intentions. An Our Father and a Hail Mary works. You also may apply additional indulgences you receive to the souls in Purgatory.

The Jubilee is intended to be a time of celebration and joy. This is my goal for the Diocese of Springfield. A pilgrimage is part of the jubilee experience. A pilgrimage is a spiritual trek which is to remind us of the journey through life. It has its challenges, but it also has many joys, the greatest of which is the destination. In life that is heaven.

Some might be able to journey to Rome to visit the great basilicas. If you can, I encourage you to make the spiritual trip. As a diocese we are offering two opportunities, one being led by our Vicar General, Fr. Piotr Calik to for young adults, ages 18 through 40. Another will be led by our Cathedral rector, Fr. Gary Dailey. There are also other priests of the diocese offering pilgrimages, and all this information can be found at diospringfield.org.

I also realize that many will not be able to make the trip to Rome. So, I have designated seven spiritual sites in western Massachusetts as sacred places for local pilgrimage during the Jubilee Year. They are:

St. Michael's Cathedral, Springfield Shrine of Divine Mercy, Stockbridge Monastery of the Mother of God, West Springfield Visitation of Mary Monastery, Tyringham St. Stanislaus Basilica, Chicopee

Our Mother of Perpetual Help Chapel, Thomas Aquinas College Northfield

Seat of Wisdom Chapel, Newman Center at UMass, Amherst

The Bishops of the United States have also designated the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception in Washington DC as a Jubilee 2025 pilgrimage site. I strongly encourage parishes and Catholic groups to organize pilgrimage trips to these sites as part of the Jubilee year celebration.

Another opportunity will be our Men's and Women's Catholic Conferences which we will resume holding. The dates are October 4<sup>th</sup> for the Men's Conference and November 15<sup>th</sup> for the Women's. Both will be held at the Bellamy School in Chicopee. These gatherings will be a very special opportunity for the renewal of faith – more details will be forthcoming.

These and other spiritual events that will take place during the upcoming Jubilee Year 2025 will offer a unique opportunity to embrace our "Walk with One" outreach. I encourage each and every Catholic to reach out to an inactive family member or friend and invite them to join you in a Jubilee event.

Finally, Pope Francis' call to be renewed in the Sacrament of Reconciliation presents us with a unique opportunity. As the pope explains, "the power of God's forgiveness can support and accompany communities and individuals on their pilgrim way." I am encouraging parishes to offer more opportunities to receive the graces of worthy confession, by providing weeknight "Keep the Light On" opportunities.

We have established a section of our diocesan website www.diospringfield.org/jubilee2025.

If we experience God's mercy, the light breaks through our darkness. The light of Christ will always conquer darkness and evil. However, like a long winter, it is sometimes easy to forget the warmth and power of God love. For this we need to renew ourselves in his mercy regularly.

In closing, I hope that the faith life here in western Massachusetts will be enriched by an earnest celebration of the Jubilee Year. This way our Jubilee year may be a blessing that extends beyond a single year, bearing rich fruit for the future of our Catholic Faith!
