FROM OUR PASTOR'S DESK

Palm Sunday 2024 Red Honor and White Honor

Brothers and Sisters, God be with you.

Today is Palm Sunday: the triumphant entry of our Lord into His city, the city of David, the earthly Jerusalem. His people wave palm branches before him and shout 'Hosanna!' to the King. Why then do Deacon and I wear Red? Shouldn't it be White? After all, we wear white on days that we honor Christ as King, on the feast of Jesus Christ King of the Universe and on Easter. White symbolizes the triumph of God over sin and death. It gives honor to the King. Red is the color for martyrs. We rightly wear red on Good Friday to represent the blood of Christ poured out for us on the Cross. So why Red on this day of triumphant entry?

Because it shows us the difference between the honor that men give and the honor that God gives. It shows the difference between the petty hopes of men and the grand designs of God. It shows the difference between the king of this world and the true King.

We need to remember that the very same crowd of people that are shouting 'Hosanna' today are the very same people who will be shouting 'Crucify him!' on Friday morning, just five days from now. We need to remember that this entrance into Jerusalem is not the triumphant entrance of a King who has conquered all the enemies of His people. This is the entrance of a warrior who comes to do battle to cleanse a sinful, earthly Jerusalem.

We wear Red because there is no lasting value in human honor. Most often we raise people onto pedestals so that it is easier for us to coat them in mud. The honor of men will always, given enough time, turn into the cross. Only the honor of God matters. The White Honor is given on Easter by God to His Son in his Resurrection. We wear Red today because today is the day that battle is joined. We wear White in a week to cry out 'Hosanna' to the triumph of our True King. But first, He must go through the Cross.
