

Easter 2024 Running to the Tomb

Brothers and Sisters, God be with you.

Happy Easter! For most of us, Easter is a time of great rejoicing: if we are older, a time for ham with family; if we are younger, a time for chocolate bunnies and jellybeans. But I would ask you this Easter to contemplate the first Easter.

Look at this tiny image of a great painting. See (if you can) the anxiety, wonder and hope on the faces of the Apostles as they hurry to the tomb of Christ. Mary Magdelene has just returned to the other Apostles and told them that the body of Jesus is missing. Peter and John are running to the tomb to see what has happened to Him.

A great danger of seeing many Easters is to grow bored with Resurrection. Jesus is risen. Sure, ok, yawn. Just another day. But this is a tremendous error. Place yourselves with the disciples as they run. What has happened? What has changed? EVERYTHING! Death itself has died. Jesus is triumphant. God has saved His people. Nothing will ever be the same again. All of creation is remade! Unless we approach Easter as they did on that first Easter, we run the risk of missing what God is revealing to us today. May God bless you all on this great day of days.
