

FROM OUR PASTOR'S DESK

Who do you say that I am?

Brothers and Sisters, God be with you.

I remember talking with a friend of mine years ago when he and his wife had just had their first child. He recounted taking the newborn in his arms and thinking, "I am no longer living for myself."

Sometimes we meet someone new and it changes our whole lives. Before we know them, our lives run along the channels of our own desires. After, our lives are completely reoriented. That is the nature of love. It changes us on our deepest level. And so, because it changes our deepest selves, love always demands sacrifice. To love we always must be ready to sacrifice our desires, and even our needs, for the good of the other.

When Jesus asks us in today's Gospel, "who do you say that I am?" He is asking us the most important question we will ever face. If he is just a teacher, or just a prophet, then we owe him honor, but not love. But if He is the Christ, if He is God, then he calls forth from us love and adoration. Our whole orientation must change. And this change of orientation is summed up in the Cross.


If the love of God has entered a fallen, sin filled world, then He will, of necessity be opposed by the forces of sin and death. If He opposes the power of sin and death using the power of force and violation, then He just perpetuates the endless cruelty. He opposes it instead with the power of God, the power of self-gift. And that is the Cross. To follow Him, to love Him, to love our neighbor in Him, we too must take up our cross and follow Him.
