

FROM OUR PASTOR'S DESK

First Sunday of Advent

When I was a young priest, about one year after ordination, I was called to the hospital to anoint a dying mother of three young children. She had a painful, terminal cancer. After celebrating Last Rites with her, I said, "Don't be afraid." She looked me square in the eye from her hospital bed and said, "Oh Father, I am in a lot of pain, but I am not afraid. Something wonderful is about to happen." A few days later she died


Christians face the ending of our personal various "worlds" in a totally unique way. This first Sunday of Advent, Jesus says that when people see their world falling apart, they find themselves "fainting with fear and with foreboding of what is coming on the world" (Luke 21:26). In our fear, our natural response is to check out, to hide our heads in drunkenness, distraction, and false securities. But Jesus commands us to "look up and raise your heads, because your redemption is drawing near." He then compares what's coming to a lovely summer in full bloom. That's what the cross and resurrection empower us to do, as strange as it may seem.

Advent challenge: What world in your life is collapsing? A relationship, a dream, a work opportunity? Maybe you're troubled by a crumbling world in the political or economic sphere. Or maybe someone you love is seriously ill or dying. Name that world or worlds. Then pray: "Lord, help me to not faint with fear. Help me to raise my head and see your redemption coming."

Holy Family Hospital in Bethlehem is a Catholic teaching hospital that stands just 1,500 steps away from the birthplace of Jesus. The neo-natal and maternity hospital seeks ensure that no woman is in the situation of our Blessed Mother, Mary, without a warm and safe place to have her child. At Holy Family Hospital, no one is ever turned away. Everyone is welcome, regardless of race, creed or ability to pay.

Bethlehem is still the quaint city you may picture from the Nativity Story. However, as Bethlehem began to get back on its feet after the pandemic, the war in Gaza broke out. Although it is 45 miles from the war zone, Bethlehem has been deeply affected by the current conflict. Most people in Bethlehem have found themselves without work for over a year. Tourism, the cornerstone of their economy, has completely stopped. The unemployment rate has skyrocketed to 90%. With a wall standing between them and the rest of the world, they fall deeper and deeper into poverty. Food insecurity is prominent, and families are having to make unimaginable choices between food, water, and essential medical services. Amid all of this, Holy Family Hospital stands as a beacon of life, peace, and hope for mothers, babies, and families in the region.

Among the services, the Hospital provides are:

- Free pre-natal and nutritional care to all expectant mothers
- Full birth and maternity services
- The only Level III NICU for babies born 34 weeks or earlier in the area
- Diabetes diagnosis and treatment for all women
- A well-woman clinic treating symptoms of menopause
- Mammograms
- A mobile clinic that travels to the surrounding Bedouin communities.



On top of the services they offer, they also employ over 200 Palestinians,

Christians and Muslims alike. They work together in harmony, with employees of one religion picking up shifts on holidays celebrated by the other.

It is an instrument of inter-religious peace -- where Muslims and Christians work side by side - and is an affirmation of life, peace, and hope in the conflict-ridden region where Jesus Christ was born.

Here at St. Patrick's Parish, we raised \$500.00 last Advent to support the Holy Family Hospital of Bethlehem. Your gifts enable the hospital to deliver these life-giving services to the most vulnerable and at-risk families in Bethlehem.

We are once again asking you to consider an Advent donation to this worthy and crucial non-profit organization.
